We're often asked by parents for advice on how best to support reading at home and so usually, around this time of the year, we hold a KS1 Reading Meeting to show parents how children learn best and how you can be involved in your child's reading journey.

Rosa and Amy focus on showing you the different strategies children use when learning to read and how we teach these in school. Rosa and Amy explain the need for fluency, phrasing and expression when reading aloud and what your role is in modelling and checking for these skills regularly at home.
