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Dear Parents/Carers;

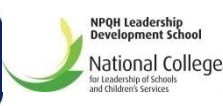
Welcome to Nursery!

- Please don't be absent - being off, even at this stage, will hinder your child's settling in.
- Remember to arrive on time – if you are late, I'll need to speak with you as your child will be missing important learning. I also will have to send you to the office to get signed in.
- Please remember to keep up toilet routines at home. The key to this is consistency. If you need help, come and talk to me and I'll put you in touch with Emma (our Family Support Advisor) who can support and offer you some useful tips.
- Please remember to wear face masks when you come inside the school building. Face masks must be worn at all times – keep yourselves and others safe.

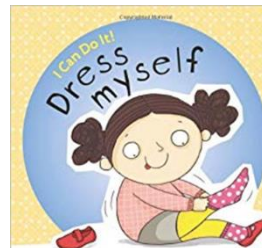
Remember communication is so important. If you're worried, unsure about anything or would just like to know how your child is learning, feel free to pop in and see us! It's good to talk.
