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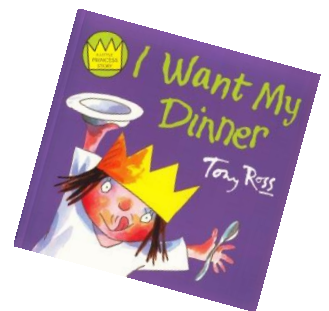
Dear Parents/Carers;

## Welcome to Nursery!

Here's some information about what your child will be working on in class next week.

We will be reading a range of different stories, including; 'I want my dinner'. We will be focussing on expressing our likes and dislikes and making a choice.

- Remember to arrive on time – if you are late, I'll need to speak with you as your child will be missing important learning. I will also have to send you to the office to get signed in. Please remember the doors are closed 8:25 AM and 12:10 PM.
- Please can you help your child become more independent, getting them to try and put on their coats and shoes is a good start.
- Please also remember to always wear a mask when on the school site – keep yourselves and others safe.
