<b>Learning Objectives</b>	<b>Learning Activities</b>	
<p>Children will be taught to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• explore the Muslim festival of Eid-UI-Fitr which occurs at the end of Ramadan, the month of fasting for Muslim people.</li> <li>• learn about how Muslims pray at the mosque and celebrate with Eid parties with family and friends, including the new clothes they wear and the greeting cards they send.</li> <li>• explore the Christian parable of the Good Samaritan. This is a story Jesus created to teach people how they can treat others who live around them.</li> </ul>	<p>Discuss the shapes of the moon and the sequencing when sighted at the beginning in the month of Ramadhan.</p> <p>Looking at and exploring geometric patterns.</p> <p>There is an opportunity to invite in a local Muslim to share what they do as a family or at their mosque to celebrate Eid-UI-Fitr.</p> <p>Discussions around different celebrations: How Samira’s family celebrate Ramadan and how Samira’s family celebrate Eid.</p> <p>Spirited play story of the good Samaritan and thinking what this hidden meaning might be.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Eid-UI- Fitr</li> <li>• Ramadhan</li> <li>• Celebration</li> <li>• Fasting</li> <li>• Mosque</li>   <li>• Jesus</li> <li>• Good Samaritan</li> <li>• Kind</li> </ul>
