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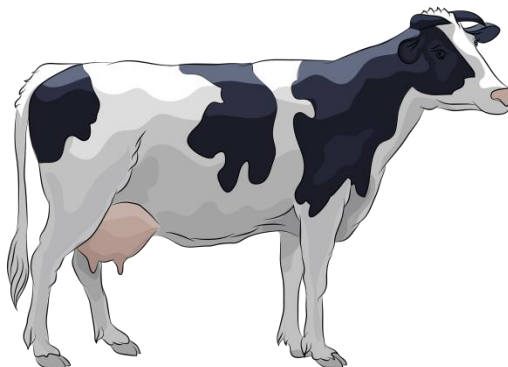
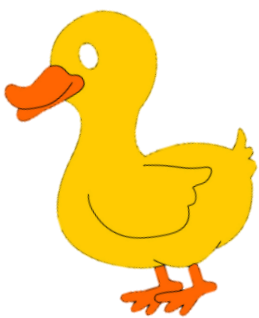

Recipe for fairy cakes

- 1 cup of Self raising flour
- $\frac{3}{4}$ of a cup of Caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- 5 tbsp. cooking butter
- 2tbsp Vanilla extract
- Few drops of milk to make a runny consistency

Mix it altogether
Evenly distribute in the cases
Cook for 10-15 minutes
