Fine Motor – Children will explore in various activities to help develop their fine motor skills.



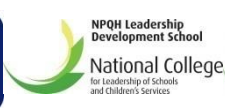
Year 1 and 2

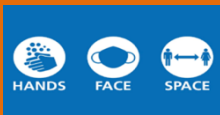


Family Learning together

Year 1 and 2 – Children are learning about habitats in science. Can you make your own habitat using boxes?

Reception – Children are developing their fine motor skills this week. At home children could use pasta tubes to thread onto string.
