# In September, we'll be back to the old normal at Thames View Infants!

Unless your child is in Year 2 now, you will not know what the old normal looks like at TVI – it's been such a long time since we were truly normal!

There'll be no more staggered starts, with the School Day starting at 8:55 and ending at 3:15. We'll keep the one-way system, but there'll be no need to wear masks on the premises. We're a PAPERLESS School – so you must download & register your ParentMail App to receive e-newsletters, to book after-school clubs & Parents' meetings or to confirm consent for educational visits.

#### After School Clubs and Breakfast Club...

We hope to be re-starting our Afterschool clubs as soon as possible after the summer break. Please keep an eye on ParentMail since our clubs are always over-subscribed and all tend to book up really quickly.

We also hope to get Breakfast Club, for our working parents, up and running as soon as we possibly can after the summer break. Again, the form will go out on ParentMail and we'll need you to complete it as soon as possible. There will be a nominal charge for Breakfast Club which will be needed, in advance, at the start of every term.



# PE Kits, Reading Books and Holiday Homework...

Please remind your child to take home their PE kit and their reading respond during the summer holidays. The homework section on our school website has over 150 downloadable resources for your child to complete at home with your child during the summer, if you wish.



It would also be a great help if you could also take the time to read as much as possible with your child over the summer. Reading, even just a little bit every day, makes a huge difference to your children's progress.

### **Buying Uniform for September...**

School uniform continues to be available for you to purchase via ParentMail. Remember, children may wear any colour polo shirt on any day, but it must be a school-branded top. We also sell PE kits as well as jumpers and cardigans for when the weather gets colder.



Please be mindful that at the start of the new academic year we are always inundated with new uniform orders and, although we will try to turn them around as quickly as possible, at our busiest times it may take up to a week to get these orders completed. For those of you with children st arting in either our Nursery or Reception settings, please remember that those children are allowed to wear their own clothes for the first few weeks of term, until they have settled in. bring your child into school wearing jewellery. If you want to get your child's ears pierced, the summer holidays are a good time to do it in - it allows the studs to have plenty of time to heal properly and decreases the chance of infection when having to take them out for school days.



### Swimming...

We are very pleased to be able to offer our Year 2 children swimming lessons as part of their PE Curriculum across the Autumn and Spring terms.

Children in New Snakes and New Owls will be going swimming once a week, starting in September, until the end of term. New Foxes will be going swimming in the Spring term.

Children will be travelling by bus to the Abbey Leisure Centre in Barking.

- New Snakes will have their lessons on Mondays, starting on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September 2021.
- New Owls will have their lessons on Thursdays, starting on Thursday 9th September 2021.
- We will confirm the days for Foxes closer to the time.



All children must bring a swimming hat, swimming costume or trunks (not swimming shorts) and a towel. If you don't already have one, swimming hats are available from the school office priced at £1.00 and children can choose whatever colour they like from Red, Blue, Yellow or Green.

In line with school policy earrings or jewellery are not allowed in the pool.

IMPORTANT Snakes and Owls Parents: Please can you make sure that your child has their swimming kit in school and ready to be used from the first day back on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2021.

The children have missed a lot of school this past year and every minute they spend in school at the moment really does count. We have some lovely activities planned for the children every day,


right up until the last day of term. So please, please make sure that you get your child into school every single day.
