Year 2 are going to Stubbers on 4th July.

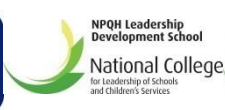
Please note that Stubbers Day is an early start and on the day the children will need to be in school for 8:30am. The coaches will be leaving at 8:45am and we will not be able to wait for any late comers.

We expect the children to be back at school by 5:30pm. If there are any slight variations to this time we will inform you via ParentMail and so please keep an eye on your ParentMail messages on the day.

What to wear...

Stubbers is a non-uniform day. Children will be taking part in numerous physical activities need to come to school wearing the following:

- T-Shirt
- Leggings or joggers
- A hoody or fleece
- Old trainers
- A sunhat (if it is a hot day)

What to bring...

In addition to the above, children will need to bring in a bag (by Wednesday 29th June) with the following:

A complete change of clothing, (including underwear and shoes):

- T-shirt
- Leggings or Joggers
- Hoody or fleece
- Underwear - knickers / pants
- Socks
- A second pair of trainers
- A towel
- An anorak if rain is forecast.

Please note that all of the children will be partaking in water activities may be going into the water wearing their clothes. In light of this, we suggest that you don't send the children in any of their best clothes and that you particularly only send in trainers / plimsoles that you understand will almost certainly get wet and muddy.

Please note that, other than the above, the children will not need to bring anything else to school on the day. School will provide packed lunches, enough fluids and snacks for the children to last the whole day.
