Identify the beat and rhythm pattern in dance music Move to the rhythm of 'Wake! Shake' action rap

Copy the 'Sing me' rhythms with voices and movement

Perform 'Wake! Shake!' with percussion

Learn to sing and play 'Play me one'

Count the snowballs thrown in the 'Snowball waltz'

Move to the steady beat of 'Boom shakala'

Accompany 'Schiarazula Marazula' with a steady beat and an ostinato

Compose an ostinato for percussion
