Dear Parents/Carers;

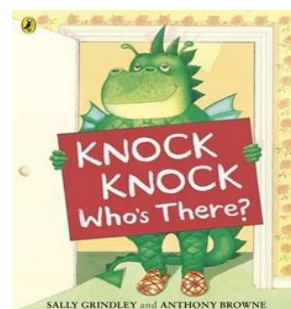
Welcome back!

We are reading the story *Knock Knock Who's There?*

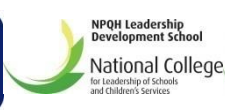
