Science – Children will learn about animals and naming body parts.

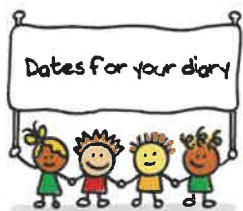
History – Children will describe old toys.
