## **Welcome to Reception!**

Hello I'm Rofiya Begum, I'm the Head of Reception and the teacher of Zebras. If you missed last week's letter here are some key messages:

Next week we are starting a new topic 'Mice'. We will introduce our shared reading and language groups too. Soon, we will also introduce phonics, P.E. and a weekly writing group. Children have settled into the routine of the school day and are starting to benefit from the directed teaching time in class. They also still enjoy plenty of 'freeflow' time to explore, learn and develop all their skills.

Every week on a Friday we send out a letter telling you what's ahead for your child. I wanted to make sure that you know what's going on in school as children don't always tell you what they've learnt, what activities they've been doing or even who they've played with.

Remember communication is so important. If you're worried, unsure about anything or would just like to know how your child is learning, feel free to pop in and see us! It's good to talk.

Children will take part in a short whole-class teaching sessions, followed by a wide range of carefully planned activities to consolidate their learning in class and outdoors. Children are also directed to join in with small group activities led by an adult. Eventually, each child will join a language group, reading and writing group and two maths groups each week.

Our "free flow" sessions take place in the morning and afternoon: each activity covers a range of the Early Years Areas of Development and include Literacy, Physical Development, Personal Social and Emotional Development, Communication and Language, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. We plan opportunities for children to explore independently, in small groups, with and without adults.







- We will make sure your child brings home a reading book each day and it's important that
  they have some time at home to read with you. Reading at home is so important, particularly
  for young children. Please read it together with your child for 10-15 minutes everyday. You
  can write comments on reading done at home in the reading records.
- Your child we need their Yellow Book Bag in School every day. As well as reading every day in school, the children feel a bit lost without them. If you lose something from your book bag, tell us and we'll replace it as quickly as possible.

Please have a little look at the **blue box** below. I will be putting something new in it each week for you to do. Sometimes it will be about what parents can do, other times it will be for children to make something with you. Please read and enjoy the different activities and let me know how it ages. Remember to tweet pictures too!
