- ✓ No hooped earrings (we recommend no studs either).

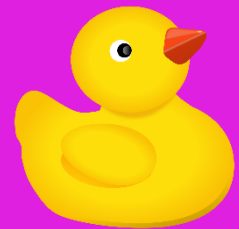
