What is Peep?

The Peep Learning Together Programme helps parents, carers and practitioners make the most of the learning opportunities in everyday life, supporting young children's learning through play.



The Peep Learning Together Programme extends what parents/carers already do to support their child's learning in everyday life.

Research has found that the main influences on young children's outcomes are the quality of the relationship with their parents and carers, and what they do with their family, from birth.

The Programme covers five strands of child development, which it aims to improve by working with parents and carers:

- personal, social and emotional development
- communication and language
- early literacy
- early maths
- health and physical development.



Sam, our Nursery Practitioner, and Jodie, our Speech and Language Teaching Assistant, have both carried out Peep training, and are holding two sessions to introduce the programme, and how it can help support our children and their families.
